

Commitment to Community Keynote Address

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: May I reserve or pick up tickets for my entire class?

A: No, you may not reserve tickets or pick up tickets in bulk. Since we do not have a facility large enough to accommodate every member of the university community, each person must pick up their own tickets. This process gives every university community member an equal opportunity to attend, and avoids the problem of university members picking up tickets for individuals who do not attend.

Q: How many tickets may I have for the keynote?

A: There is a limit of one ticket per person.

Q: Do I have to pick up my ticket or will you mail them to me?

A: Yes. Each person must pick up their own ticket. During the school year, the Anderson Center is open from 7:00 AM to 2:00 PM.

Q: What if I cannot attend the address? Will the address be videotaped?

A: Yes, the keynote address will be videotaped and re-shown at a later date to accommodate the interests of those who are not able to attend because of work, class, athletic or other commitments. The viewings are scheduled for:

- **Tuesday, October 8; 7:00 PM in 100E Giddens Learning Center**

Q: Why did Commitment to Community move the address from Thursday evening to Tuesday afternoon?

A: We moved the date to allow us to have a follow-up event with the speaker so that those interested in hearing more from the speaker and/or delving deeper into the topic will have a chance to do so.

Q: Will there be other opportunities for the speaker to interact with the university community? For instance, could I invite the speaker to my class, meeting or event?

A: Yes, there will be one additional public event with Tim Rise. After the Commitment to Community Keynote Address on Tuesday, October 1, join university and community members for a viewing and dialogue with anti-racism author Tim Wise about his new film **“White Like Me.”** Open and free to the public. Tickets are not needed for this event.
