

ON-CAMPUS HOUSING INFORMATION

We're excited that you'll be staying with us on campus for the July Residency. While it's not a hotel, our campus apartments do offer a convenient and comfortable place to stay for the 10 or 11 days you're on campus. The information below should help you get ready for your stay on campus.

The Hamline Apartments

You'll be staying in the 3-story Hamline Apartments. Students will be housed on the 2nd and 3rd floors. You'll have your own bedroom in these 2 and 3 bedroom apartments with a shared living area, kitchen and bathroom. The building is air-conditioned. Each bedroom is furnished with extra long twin size beds (if you want to bring your own sheets—that's important to know!), a pillow, study desks, chairs, dressers and wardrobes and/or closets. There will be up to three adults of the same gender housed in each apartment. You'll receive 2 linen packets when you check in for your stay. Packets include sheets, pillow case, towels, and washcloth. Extra towels and blankets will be available as needed. You might want to think about bringing a mattress pad...it helps. (I saw one for a Twin XL at Target for \$6.99).

Housekeeping services are provided for common areas only; there is no maid service for the apartments. There are washers and dryers available free of charge on each floor of the building. We'll provide you with a packet of detergent at check-in.

While there are kitchens in each of the units, plates, silverware, pots/pans, etc. are not provided.

Other residents in the building during your stay will include Law, Graduate and upper-class undergraduate students. The building has 24-hour security card access. (Your Hamline ID will be activated and get you in/out of the building)

Additional information about the Apartments at Hamline University

- Students will be given 2 linen packets.
- Housekeeping is not available; you are responsible for your own room cleaning.
- All buildings are smoke free – including bedrooms and bathrooms.
- Alcohol is allowed by individuals 21 and over in the privacy of their own room.
- Alcohol is not permitted in lounges and open areas.
- Pets are not allowed.

Check-In

Check-in for the program takes place in **the lobby of the Hamline Apartments A** welcome table will be staffed the following days/times:

- **Thursday, July 9: 9:00 am – 6:00 pm**
- **Friday, July 10: 9:00 am – 12:30 pm**

At check-in, you'll receive a name tag and a residency packet chock-full of important information. You'll also receive your room key and be able to get settled into your apartment. **The Hamline Apartments are located at 1470 Englewood Avenue in St.**

Please let me know you'll be arriving to campus beyond the hours that the check-in table will be open. If you're staying on campus, we'll need to make arrangements for you to get apartment keys when you arrive.

You will need your student ID to gain access to the exterior door of the apartment building. **Returning students: Remember to bring your ID with you.** New students will receive a temporary access card to use until you have your Hamline ID. Your initial student ID is free of charge; however there is a fee for each replacement card.

Check-Out: Monday, July 20

Students need to be checked out of their rooms 12 noon on Monday, July 20. Prior to leaving your room, please place your sheets and towels in the pillow case. The pillow and blanket can be placed on the bed. All trash should be removed from the room and placed in the appropriate trash receptacle. Please return your key to the Summer Programs Desk at Sorin Hall during desk hours. Failure to comply with the check out policies will result in a \$30.00 improper check out fee.

While we'll have some shuttle vans running to the airport on Monday at various times, you may need to make your own arrangements for getting to the airport.

Internet Access

Each residence hall room is wired to support Internet access through an ethernet or wireless connection. There are computer labs available in the Library with access to printers.

Phones

Because we know that most of our students have cell phones we do not automatically put phones in any of the apartments. We have a limited number of phones that we can make available to those students who would like them.

Dining Service Information

Most of our meals during the Summer Residency are served in Sorin Hall. **Breakfast each morning is included as part of your housing package.** Your name will be on a list at the cashier stand at Sorin, you'll just need to give them your name to gain entrance for breakfast. Lunch and dinner can be purchased with cash or credit card. Meal times in Sorin Hall are as follows:

Breakfast	8am-9am
Lunch	11:00am-1pm
Dinner	4:30pm-6pm

Smoking and Alcohol

Smoking is prohibited in all university facilities. You must stand at least 25 feet away from any building if you choose to smoke on campus. Alcohol is not permitted in lounges and other common areas. You can keep and consume alcohol in your room.

Things you might want to bring want for your stay:

- Alarm clock
- Your own Pillow (Recommend)
- Twin XL Sized Sheets (Although sheets are provided, they are institutional sheets and do not have the feel of cotton)
- A mattress pad
- Towel (Again, towels are provided but they are somewhat institutional)
- Bathrobe
- Flip-flops
- Laptop
- Fan – (Rooms are air conditioned, but can provide extra air flow)
- Iron
- Small desk lamp
- Radio/CD player
- Clothes hangers
- Ear plugs (To drown out the noise of the snoring writer next door)
- Toiletries (Soap, shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrush, etc.)
- Aspirin/ Non-aspirin/ Allergy medicine
- Snacks (To fuel those overworked brain cells)
- Notebooks, Folders, Pens
- Reusable water bottle

Shuttle Run to Target

If you don't have room for everything, don't worry---we'll be offering a shuttle van to Super Target at the beginning of the residency.

Lost Keys

You will be charged a replacement fee if you lose your apartment key.

Safety and Security

The Hamline campus is located in an urban environment, so we always tell people that they need to take common sense precautions when it comes to personal safety. We've had very few incidents on campus. Nonetheless, you should always be aware of your surroundings and walk in pairs at night. Located in Drew Residence Hall, Safety and Security is open 24 hours a day. The staff will happily escort you to and from your car, or to the apartments on campus for those late nights at the library when you just don't feel safe walking alone.

Walker Athletic Facilities

You should bring workout clothes with you. We have a nice athletic facility that is free for all Hamline students. It includes a weight room, pool, running track, and plenty of workout equipment. You need to show your Hamline ID to get in. We'll have hours for you at check in.

Parking: During the month of January and over the summer there is no ticketing in the Hamline lots. Feel free to park in any lot for general parking. (Not in visitor or assigned spaces!)
