Collaborative Research Proposal Guidelines

Your proposal should include the following:

- **DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE** - State exactly what your project is and why it is important.
- **METHODOLOGY** - Explain how you plan to organize your project. Try to be as specific as possible. What are the steps or methods you will follow to achieve your end? Include a timeline if possible. What sources will you use? Include a bibliography if appropriate.
- **INDEPENDENT CRITICAL INQUIRY AND INFORMATION LITERACY** - If you will be earning the Hamline Plan "Q" through this project, address how this experience will demonstrate your "Q" abilities (frame a meaningful question, develop appropriate and responsible methods of investigation, integrate multiple perspectives, and present results).
- **PROJECT OUTCOMES** - Indicate the nature of anticipated closure or culmination of this project (e.g., a paper, report, presentation).
- **STUDENT-FACULTY COLLABORATION** - Describe your faculty collaborator's and your individual contributions as well as how you and your faculty collaborator will negotiate your collaboration on this project.
- **TIME COMMITMENT** - Indicate the number of hours you anticipate spending on your project. If possible, include a breakdown of hours spent doing research alone and hours spent with a faculty member. As a general guideline, you should spend an equal amount of time and effort on the project as you would spend in class and completing assignments for an academic course of the same credit value. For summer courses, a minimum of 35-40 hours per week is required.

Note about Summer Housing - Free on-campus housing is available during the summer for students doing collaborative research and is granted on a first come-first served basis. The housing is for ten weeks beginning with the first day of Summer Term classes. If you wish to be considered, fill out a summer housing card at the Office of Residential Life (make sure you indicate on the card that you are a summer research student). You will be notified at the beginning of May as to your housing assignment.
