

Hamline Graduation Requirements for Faculty Advisor Training

D- is considered “passing” for Hamline Plan courses

First-Year Seminar (FYSem)	First-year students take a FYSem in the first term of the first year. This requirement is waived for transfer students and students 25 years and older. FYSem cannot be taken P/NC, dropped or withdrawn.
Expository Writing (E)	First Year Writing 1120: Composition and Research, must be taken during the first year. This is not a Writing-Intensive. To transfer in, E usually must be at Composition/Writing II level.
Writing Intensive (W)	Students who enter Hamline as first-year students must take one writing-intensive course for each <i>full</i> year of study after their first year (SO, JR, SR years). One must be taken within the major program. Transfer students must take one W course for each full year of study at Hamline starting their first year, even if they are taking their E in their first year. Writing Intensives must be completed at Hamline. Students may not take multiple Ws in one year and apply them to a future year.
Speaking Intensive (O)	Two courses, which may be taken any time and in any department. One speaking-intensive course may be transferred to Hamline; one must be taken at Hamline. Transfer students who transfer in 64 or more credits only need one speaking-intensive course, but it must be taken at Hamline.
Formal Reasoning (R) and Quantitative Reasoning (M)	Two courses or one course that carries both designations.
Disciplinary Breadth (F, H, N1, N2, S)	<p>Eight <i>credits</i> total in the fine arts. An exception is made for 3-credit courses transferred to Hamline—the 4th credit does not have to be made up in those instances.</p> <p>Two <i>courses</i> each in: humanities, natural sciences (one must include a lab) and social sciences. Note: If transferring fine arts courses worth fewer than four credits, please see Academic Advising.</p>
Diversity (D)	Two courses. Goals of the Diversity requirement are to help students learn to demonstrate an understanding of systemic inequalities, power differences, and interdependencies of people in a diverse world.
Global Citizenship (G)	One course. Global citizenship is grounded in critical and multidisciplinary analyses of and engagement with complex, interdependent global systems and their implications for people’s lives and the earth’s sustainability. Pre-Fall 2018 admits can take 3 Ds or 2Ds and 1 G.
Independent Critical Inquiry & Information Literacy (Q)	Learning outcomes for this category include gaining the ability to frame a critical inquiry project and integrate multiple perspectives in presenting information.
Collaboration (C)	Students complete one course that focuses on developing and strengthening collaborative skills by engaging with team-based processes. Pre-Fall admits do not need C.
LEAP (P)	Liberal Education as Practice: LEAP experiences include internships, collaborative research projects, and courses including community-based, experiential components.

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Major	A field of concentration, ranging from nine to nineteen courses. For the most up-to-date listing of major and minor requirements, visit: www.hamline.edu/ugrequirements or the Hamline Bulletin. Major courses must be passed with C- or higher. Students must declare their major by the end of their sophomore year or 64 credits earned, whichever comes later.
Minor (optional)	A field of concentration, ranging from five to eight courses.
Breadth of Study	48 credits outside the major department. Supporting courses that are required in the major, but are not in the department, may count towards the breadth of study requirement.
Graduation Credits	All students are required to complete a minimum of 128 credits and obtain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 in order to graduate. A minimum of 56 residency credits (60 for Latin honors) must be taken at Hamline, as well as 28 of the last 32 credits. If pursuing more than one degree (e.g. BA and BS, 140 credits are required).

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
