TRANSFER APPLICATION

Take your first step toward becoming a Piper by applying to Hamline.

Spring admission deadlines

Early action: Apply prior to the **November 15** deadline, and you will be considered for early action.

Regular decision: Apply after **November 15** and prior to the **January 10** deadline to be considered for regular decision.

Rolling admission: Apply **after January 10**, and you will be considered for rolling admission.

Fall admission deadlines

Early action: Apply prior to the **March 15** deadline, and you will be considered for early action.

Regular decision: Apply after **March 15** and prior to the **August 1** deadline to be considered for regular decision.

Rolling admission: Apply **after August 1**, and you will be considered for rolling admission.

Methods of application

Hamline accepts both the Hamline University Application, found at hamline.edu/transferapp, and the Common Application. There is no fee to use either of these programs. You may use the online or print version of the Common Application; the online version is available at commonapp.org.

When to apply

We encourage you to apply as soon as you make the decision to transfer. Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis, and accepted students are sent class registration materials after the deposit is received. Your admission decision will be sent approximately two to four weeks after you apply.

How to apply

1. Complete the application, including the essay (250 words minimum).
2. Send us official transcripts from each college you have attended. If you have completed less than a year of full-time college coursework (approximately 24 credits), also send us an official copy of your high school transcripts, including ACT or SAT scores.
3. Send the Dean of Students form to the dean of the most recent college or university you attended. The form can be found at hamline.edu/transferapp.
4. Letters of recommendation and résumé are not required for transfer students but will be considered if included with application materials. Materials may be submitted to admission@hamline.edu.
