This Agreement is entered into between North Hennepin Community College (hereinafter sending institution), and Hamline University, St. Paul (hereinafter receiving institution). This Agreement and any amendments and supplements, shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota.

The sending institution has established a Paralegal AS (hereinafter sending program), and the receiving institution has established a Legal Studies BA (hereinafter receiving program), and will facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related program to another. It is mutually agreed:

## Admission and Graduation Requirements

A. The receiving institution's admission and program admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
B. Students must fulfill the graduation requirements at both institutions.
C. Students must complete the entire sending program and meet the receiving institution's admission requirements for the agreement to apply.

## Transfer of Credits

A. The receiving institution will accept 60 credits from the sending program. A total of 68 credits remain to complete the receiving program.
B. Courses will transfer as described in the attached Program Articulation Table. For system institutions, once the courses are encoded, they will transfer as described in the uSelect Audit.
C. All courses must be completed with a grade of $C$ - or higher

## Implementation and Review

A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements; assuring compliance with system policy, procedure, and guidelines; and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
B. This Articulation Agreement is effective on March 1, 2023 and shall remain in effect for five years unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
C. The college and university shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
D. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning September 1, 2027 (within six months of the end date).
E. When a student notifies the receiving institution of an intent to follow this agreement, the receiving institution will encode course waivers and substitutions for that student.
