

## Hamline University Undergraduate Transfer of Credit Hamline Plan Alignment with Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC)

Transfer courses must be considered college level and relevant to a liberal arts degree, and a student must have earned a C- or above. Syllabi may be required to make a final determination regarding credit transfer.
