



Program Highlights:

Throughout this program, you will:

- Explore the temples and ruins of the ancient Khmer civilization including Angkor Wat, Banteay Srei, Bayon, Ta Prohm, and Beng Mealea.
- Learn about the intersections between global tourism and heritage preservation at these World Heritage sites.
- Visit rural Cambodia including a homestay in a farming village near the site of Banteay Chhmar and a boat tour of the fishing villages around Tonle Sap.
- Tour by bike through rural areas around Siem Reap to better understand the impact of Angkor Park/preservation/tourism on the lives of the villagers living in the park.
- Experience other aspects of contemporary Khmer culture and recent history through visits to markets, Buddhist temples, artisan workshops, and the sites of the Khmer Rouge genocide.
- Throughout all of our travels, we will have an experienced local guide, Dr. Vudthy Long, to answer our questions and help us understand Khmer history, language, and culture.
