Course Description: EDUC 7140 Foundations of Bullying Prevention

This course provides a research base for understanding various types of bullying, characteristics of those who engage in bullying behavior, and essential elements of successful strategies to prevent bullying behavior. It will also consider practical strategies for creating system-wide changes in bullying and bystander behaviors.

Course Description: EDUC 7141 Bystander Behavior and Bullying Prevention

This course provides a clear understanding of the implications of state, district and school level policies regarding bullying. The course provides knowledge to interpret state and federal initiatives concerning policy and laws related to bullying. A particular focus will provide a framework for enhancing current policy to be both comprehensive and inclusive.

Course Description: EDUC 7142 LGBTQ and Gender-Based Bullying

This course focuses on fostering an environment in which all students feel welcomed and safe. It will provide strategies for creating a gender-expansive classroom and a framework for teaching and embracing family diversity. This course will provide skills for responding to anti-gay and gender-related comments often associated with bullying.

Course Description: EDUC 7143 Cyber Bullying

This course examines various types of cyber bullying that occur at different age levels. It will provide a knowledge base to successfully address and manage cyber bullying in schools and classrooms as well as provide tools to work with parents and the community to combat bullying that can occur in social networking.

Course Description: EDUC 7145 Final Synthesis Bullying Prevention Certificate

This required final course is an opportunity to integrate learning from previous courses through a project which applies that learning to professional practice. The project may be done individually or collaboratively. It may take the form of a paper, Power Point presentation, professional development workshop, policy development recommendations, etc. Students meet in a seminar setting and consult with peers and instructor about their project's development. Final sharing with course participants is an expectation.
