**Notes:**

\*For retention purposes, the original cohort reflects the total number of first-year students (full-time and part-time), whereas the graduation rates, which come from our reporting to IPEDS, uses a cohort of only full-time, first-year students (students who entered Hamline as first-years but were full-time students, these students did not need to stay full-time for their entire Hamline career). Graduation rate calculations also exclude students who died or were totally and permanently disabled, or who left for military service or church missions. The initial cohort numbers for the grad rates do not adjust for exclusions.

^Preliminary graduation rates - final IPEDS adjusted cohorts and grad rates have not been calculated, therefore rates are based off of Initial Full-time, First-year Cohort and may change when IPEDS is completed for this cohort.

"First-year" = a student who has never previously enrolled solely as a degree-/certificate-seeking college student.

Retention rates reflect enrollment in a bachelor's program as of census day of the given term.

Graduation rates reflect graduation by August 31 of the given year.
